

Guidelines for the good practices

During the exchange visits you will reflect upon each other's good practices. The visiting organisations will ask questions to better understand the setup and the results of your project. Use their input to improve the description of your good practice. We have adapted the format, so please complete the new format and submit it to us.

With your consent, all submitted good practices will be compiled and published in a booklet on advocacy for inclusion. In addition to this, the submissions will be appraised by a jury and one good practice per country will be awarded a prize of €5000,-.

Tips & Tricks for a good description

- Pick a specific project or even a specific part from a project that you consider to be successful
- Use concrete examples and avoid general descriptions
- Stick to the word count as given. We will consider this during the appraisal of your submission
- Emphasize the (type of) advocacy actions, the role of the target group and the role of intersectionality as much as possible

Submission

- Deadline of submission: 7 September 2019

- If possible send pictures and/or video about your project aside of the written description. <u>Do not</u> add the pictures in the best practice format, but attach them separately in the email.

Selection criteria for the award

Good practice project is/has:

- Started or has finished in the last 2 years
- Focusing on impact-full advocacy for inclusive society for at least one of the following target groups: 1. Indigenous groups and ethnic minorities; 2. Age-discriminated vulnerable groups, notably the young and the elderly; 3. Groups discriminated by their sexual orientation, gender identity and/or expression, and/or sexual characteristics (SOGIESC); 4. People with disabilities 5. Women facing exploitation, abuse and/or violence.
- Implemented with close participation of target group (preferably target group led)
- Strong communication materials about the project and its results
- Capitalized clear lessons learned for other similar initiatives
